Specific work will include conducting legal research and writing assistance to State partners on topics of public international law; the preparation of related training materials; attending meetings with State partners at the Missions of the United Nations; and attendances at international treaty negotiations at the United Nations and other diplomatic fora.

Qualifications: A solid academic foundation in public international law, or a specific topic given a specific project, is required. Experience working with public international law is preferred but not required. Fluency in French or Spanish is a bonus.

Work schedule: A minimum of 8 hours a week, with the possibility of further hours.
